
Padstow Neighbourhood Plan Community Consultation



Purpose of Report

This report presents and analyses the response to the recent Neighbourhood Plan Community Consultation, carried out in the Padstow neighbourhood area¹ on the Aims and Objectives of the Plan. The report includes recommendations (from page 6) on the Aims and Objectives that should be adopted for the Padstow Neighbourhood Plan.

Introduction

Neighbourhood planning in Padstow has been in progress since early 2013. It has stepped up a pace over the past 12 months. The process is being 'steered' by a Steering Group of local people appointed by the Padstow Town Council. The Steering Group's project plan and current timetable, and where we are (at March 2018), is summarised in the table below.

Following a Workshop session² on aims and objectives, which took place on the 10th January 2018, the Steering Group, at its meeting on the 23rd January 2018, approved a set of draft aims and initial objectives for the Neighbourhood Plan to be shared with the community at large for its consideration and comment. It was agreed to carry out this consultation between the 22nd and the 26th February 2018 by way of public exhibitions at:

- Trevone Village Hall Thursday 22 February 3pm to 7pm
- Station House, Padstow (Council Offices) Saturday 24 February 10am to 2pm
- Station House, Padstow (Council Offices) Monday 26 February 10am to 2pm

Consultation Stage C2

The purpose of this stage of the community engagement programme (C2 on project plan above) is to:

- share a set of draft aims and objectives for the Padstow Neighbourhood Plan
- seek reaction/endorsement of the proposed vision and approach
- explore the themes and priorities for neighbourhood planning policies
- invite suggestions for specific planning policies

The Steering Group decided that the best method to do this was to hold an exhibition to display the draft proposals and allow local people to view them together and share their reaction and responses.

Organising the Event/Exhibition

The Steering Group has been fortunate to have had the help of the staff of Padstow Town Council to take on the responsibility for organising the consultation event. The value of having this resource is reflected in the thoroughness by which the consultation event was publicised (see next section). The Steering Group should be very grateful for all the work that the Town Council's team has put in to organising, publicising and supporting the consultation event and making it successful.

Publicity

Leaflets advertising the up-coming consultation were delivered to households throughout the area. 2,000 leaflets were distributed to addresses in Padstow and Trevone, as well as over 100 being sent home with pupils of the primary school. Notice was placed in the February 2018 editions of 'Local Eyes', which has a circulation of 7,500, and 'St Petrocs Magazine', with a circulation of 450. Posters (29 in total) were displayed at locations around Padstow and Trevone. Notice of the Community Consultation event was also posted on the Town Council's website and various social media platforms. Direct email notice was also sent to members of the Steering Group, the Working Group, participants in the January 2018 Workshop, everyone on the Neighbourhood Plan database and the 35 local groups and organisations who were contacted last year during the evidence gathering stage. (Examples of the publicity material can be found in appendix E.)

Content

A set of exhibition boards comprising the **draft aims** on a topic by topic basis was the focus of the exhibition. Set alongside them were some **initial objectives**, that were generated by the Workshop on 10th January 2018. A few snap survey sheets were also included, in an attempt to up-date our understanding of community opinion on matters that were identified as knowledge gaps whilst gathering the local evidence³ for the Neighbourhood Plan.

Members of the Steering Group were on hand to encourage members of the public to express agreement or otherwise by using the dots available and to contribute their own thoughts on what should be the objectives of the Neighbourhood Plan and to add any other comments by using the 'post-it' notes.

Response and Interpretation

Not everybody used the sticky dots or the post-its available to express their opinion. Although it is reported that most people did use the dots. There was plenty of conversation between visitors and the members of the Steering Group, during which many valid opinions were expressed. Appendix A provides the dot counts on a topic by topic basis for each draft aim and initial objective, together with transcriptions of the written suggestions and comments made on post-it notes. Other comments made are transcribed in appendix B. The response to the snap survey questions is set out in appendix C.

Draft Aims

The response to the draft aims as represented by the poll of dots is summarised below. A net total of more than 50 positive responses is graded as receiving very strong support i.e. 'VS' in the table below. Fewer positive responses are graded as follows: 40-50 dots = strong support (S); 30-40 dots = moderate support (M); Less than 30 dots = weaker support (W).

Draft Objectives

The Workshop in January 2018 found time to generate several draft objectives for each topic. These were offered to the community at the consultation event as initial objectives that may help achieve the aims. Attendees at the Exhibition were encouraged to react to them, by way of agreement (using green dots) or disagreement (using red dots). As important, people were asked to add their own suggestions and comments on what the objectives should seek to achieve, or to react to the contributions of others. The following is brief summary of how the community (as represented by those that attended the Consultation events) has reacted and responded to the different topics:

Natural Environment

The initial objectives focussed on recognising and protecting what is special about the local countryside and natural environment. The reaction to them is very supportive and unambiguous. There is much ambiguity however over the community's regard to the possibility of large-scale renewable energy schemes.

Built Environment and Heritage

The community supports objectives that would apply some control over new development to ensure it fits in and contributes positively to the character of the built environment. Defining the settlement boundaries to ensure that development takes place in the right places is also considered important.

Housing

The community is supportive of housing development if it addresses local housing needs and priority is given to households with a local connection. There is some desire to see limitations on the growth of second homes in the area. Whatever new housing is built, it should be to a high standard of design and sustainability.

Transport, Traffic and Parking

Traffic and parking are significant issues to the community. The response from the consultation shows there is support for further regulation and control on traffic in town, but no clear agreement as to what would be appropriate. Similarly, with parking solutions, people seem to know what they don't want. There is some support for parking schemes that would favour local residents. Measures and initiatives that would reduce the need to use the private motor car have support in principle. Although community opinion is clearly divided over the value of encouraging and facilitating the cyclist further.

Local Economy and Tourism

This topic did not attract a great deal of comment and reaction. Improvements and a rationalisation of existing industrial and business areas drew the most support. There is a clear indication that the time is right for a local campaign against one-use plastic.

Community Services, Facilities and Infrastructure

The continued improvement of public services and the availability of public conveniences in the area are of importance to the community.

Leisure and Recreation

The community seems to be of the opinion that it is more important to maintain and improve what it already has, rather than provide new facilities and opportunities. It is considered important to minimise the impact of leisure and recreation activity so as to protect the environment and keep areas clean, tidy and fit for all to enjoy.



Conclusions

It should be noted that the draft aims and initial objectives were not regarded as the finished article and all of them were subject to change as a result of community consultation. It was also recognised that some of them were not as focussed on land use aspects as they will need to be if they are to influence the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan. This was understood.

Attendees at the consultation events were advised that the Plan could not address such problems as dog-fouling, litter and cleaning services, repairs to pot-holes in the street etc. It was thought inevitable that some of these would get raised and some were. Generally, however people did focus on development-related matters and, what is a very encouraging and positive response, can be used to refine and restructure the aims and objectives for the Neighbourhood Plan to reflect community aspirations and priorities. Those other matters that are not land-use-related have been listed separately (see appendix D) and should be referred directly to Padstow Town Council for consideration and action as appropriate.

The snap surveys attracted a limited response. Rather than react to something, they presented people with a blank sheet and asked them to provide ideas as to what further could or should be done. Nevertheless, the answers received have added to our understanding of how parishioners regard their neighbourhood and there are several ideas and many locations identified that should be considered as policies are developed and detailed.

Revisions and Recommendations

As a result of my analysis of the responses and comments received during the Community Consultation Events in February 2018, I recommended that changes are made to the set of draft aims and objectives and the following are considered for adoption as the aims and objectives of the Padstow Neighbourhood Plan:
