AGENDA ITEM 4: Police report

PC Amy Honeywill contacted the office on 21.08.20 with the following update:

'Officers from the Neighbourhood Team have been on foot patrol in Padstow over the past month and working with our partner agencies including The Town Council, Cornwall Councils Environmental Protection Officers and The Padstow Harbour office to look at concerns raised over Street Traders in the town.

Others issues such as the flow of traffic through the town center has been monitored and discussed. Street drinking in the town is being monitored and reviewed and we have consulted with licensed premises and our licensing enforcement officer. We have also spoken to visitors and given advice regarding drinking in the street. We have liaised with Border Force for our area including any issues or concerns in Padstow.

Officer's have spoken with business owners over the busy period to offer advice and support. Police have continued to show a visible presence in Padstow town during busy period, which we feel has been busier than previous years. We have dealt with parking complaints and offered advice to both residents and visitors. We have also offered advice and enforcement in relation to Covid breaches including social distancing, gatherings and quarantine periods from return travel.

The meetings that we have had have been positive and we feel we are making progress and improvements in the town. There are Plans in place to improve the town center for next summer.

Over all we have had a positive summer period considering how busy it has been, as well as the added pressures of the Covid 19 pandemic. We have worked well with our partner agencies and residents and wish to thank them for their support. We are also pleased that we have 2 Neighbourhood Beat Managers for our area, compared to just 1 for last year. PC Amy Honeywill was joined by PC Alex Allen in November 2019. Due to this increase in staffing we feel that we can provide more time, support and a visible Police presence in our large area that we cover. We cover many rural villages and towns and cover from Bedruthan Steps near Mawgan Porth to Port Gaverne as well as Wadebridge town and anything in between. Having an extra officer has been very beneficial. We hope that Padstow residents, businesses, and the Town Council have felt that a good service has been provided by the Police over this busy period. We will continue to be visible and and look forward to working with you all in the future. Thank you, PC Amy Honeywill'



Latest ONS Crime in England & Wales figures 12 months to Dec 2019




A quad bike and a cattle box have been stolen from a farm in the St Clether area of east Cornwall.



AGENGA ITEM 10: UPDATE TOWN OPENING

1. Actions from Last Meeting

- 1.1 Following the last meeting the improvements agreed by Council have been put into place, these were:-
 - Information leaflet finalised. It was also sent to TIC/PHC and made available on our website.
 - COVID19 banners and larger posters. These were finalised and delivery was quicker than anticipated. These have been placed in key areas, with the large posters on our bandstand. Copies were also given to the TIC and PHC to display.
 - Benches placed on paved area in front of the bandstand. This has alleviated some of the issues with crowding in that area. However, it is acknowledged that further improvements could be made. This is being looked at and taken forward such as further line work or possible planters.
 - Partial road closure has been in force since beginning of August.
 The Town Clerk is aware of two comments who have raised issues these have been fed into the conversations and discussions on the road closure.

2. Update

- 2.1 The Town Clerk has been keeping in contact with all involved and an issue that did come up was the need for improved signage to try to capture vehicles before they venture toward town and also improved signage on the Railway Car Park alerting any cars who get to that point that the PHC car park is full and of partial closure.
- 2.2 We are finding it busier which is down to more people coming to our town and likely impact of no overspill car parking provisions at this time. To assist it was possible to put in place additional agency cover on the Council car park, during core times (10.30 am to 2.30 pm) to help with the flow of traffic, which is particularly important when so many cars are making their way down the hill to car parks that are full. To assist we also designed and drew up town maps which offer further detail of all town parking.

3. Partner Site Update Meeting: 19 August 2020

3.1 A further meeting was held with the key representatives from CC, PTC and PHC. The timing was changed and unfortunately the Town Clerk was unable to attend, however Cllr Buscombe attended who also invited Cllr O'Keefe along who was in the area at the time.

Cllr Buscombe advised:-


- Positivity in joint working which has seen an improvement to some areas of concern already realised not perfect but a willingness is there to continue to work together.
- Acknowledged there are issues with the amount of traffic.
 Unfortunately, there is no easy straight forward fix. A lot is down to just the sheer volume. CC has put forward proposals for improved and better signage to help outlined in Appendix 1. This should be in place for early part of w/c 24 August.
- Some concerns highlighted with communications between PHC and PTC when the town is busy with vehicles. This relates to the sheer

volume of vehicles which is then causing traffic issues. NB: 19.8.20 the issue was a bus which blocked the Railway Car Park which then impacted on vehicles not entering the Railway Car Park and then continuing into town. The car park attendant dealt with the issue and the Town Clerk contacted PHC. It is considered the extra help on the car park and improved signage which CC are dealing with will help.

- CC conducted check on traders in the area, with no issues. Issue with chains to secure sign on the bandstand. This has now been removed and area has been marked as "keep clear".
- Mention of traders keeping their stalls overnight on PTC land. The
 Town Clerk was aware and has taken advice from the police. We
 are required to place a notice on the same giving the owner a
 couple days to remove, if not we can then remove it and place in
 safe keeping until they arrange a convenient time to collect.
- Cllr Buscombe has made comment that with Spain and France and other countries being subject to quarantine restrictions we may well see our summer season extended into September/October, therefore keeping the partial road closure around the quay side could be a good idea to maintain. What are Council's views.

4. Going Forward

- 4.1 Its considered that we will maintain our regular joint meetings, which have worked well.
- 4.2 We should take stock of this season, take on board lessons learnt and develop together a town plan for next season taking into account likely continued volume of tourist and COVID19.
