As you can see, the number of reported crimes is up by 28% but overall the number remains low at only 9 crimes for this period with a 100% decrease in Criminal Damage, Possession of drugs and other offences.

On the right, you will see figures for the number of reported incidents i.e. calls to Police from members of the public. These figures are calculated using the 'closing qualifiers' which translates to the category of incident upon closure of the log (which can differ from when the call was taken). There is a reduction in reports of ASB and a small increase in Public Safety and motoring offences, but again these figures are relatively low.

In other news, Neighbourhood Beat Manager PC Amy Honeywill remains on secondment to the driver training department until January however, we have PC Adam Pickin who is working at Bodmin and Wadebridge as a temporary Neighbourhood Beat Manager. Devon and Cornwall Police are now recruiting for Volunteer Police Cadets. Initially, the Cadet Unit will be based at Bodmin Police Station but there is nothing to preclude students, aged 13yrs up to 18yrs, from Wadebridge and Padstow becoming involved. Eventually there may even be a unit at Wadebridge, if the numbers support it. For more information, visit vpc.police.uk
