Agenda Item 7: 2022/23 Update and Budget 2023/24 (including fees and charges):

1. 2022/23 Income Update

1.1 Car Park Income Update

Following the increase in tariffs in 2021 car park income has performed fairly well this year, as detailed in the car park takings summary (appendix 1). Visitor numbers for the main season appeared to be lower this year in comparison with the last two years, the last two years being exceptional with opening up after lockdown and more staycations, with uncertainty around foreign travel.

Car Park users can pay by coins or RingGo. RingGo now has a zero-motorist convenience fee, following negotiation of a new 4-year contract, that was agreed by Council on 23.6.21. There were issues with internet connectivity and RingGo this summer, which we think was probably due to a mast being out of action

2. Expenditure Update

2.1 <u>Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO)</u>

Cornwall Council (CC) now enforce PTC Railway and Lawn car parks. A Service Level Agreement (SLA) was negotiated in the current year and will be looked at again next year. The Budget 2022-23 was £5000 for a CEO and actual cost was £3032 up to 31.8.22.

2.2 Car park machines

Overall, the car park machines have performed well. However, they are beginning to show their age and improvements can be made to offer the public more options for payment. The RFO has drafted a report for Committee's consideration at Confidential Agenda Item 10.

2.3 Signs

The Budget 2022-23 for signs was £10,000 and the actual cost up to 31.8.22 is £0. There has been no cost as signage for improvements to the town has been funded by Cornwall Council via their Community Network Highway Scheme. Cornwall Council has advised that these will be put in place before the main season commences next year.

2.4 Non-Domestic Rates

The Non-Domestic Rates for the Railway car park are £56,320pa and the Lawn car park is £14,970pa in 2022-23.

2.5 Car Park Cash Collections

Car park machine cash collections are undertaken by G4S and these have gradually reduced over the last few years, as RingGo has been used more, these will be reduced further in 2023-24. The cost per cash box collection is £10.89.

3. Fees and Charges:

3.1 Car Park Charges

The car park tariffs were increased on 1 March 2021, with the Car Park Order, car park machines and tariff boards updated at the same time.

In respect of season tickets the cost is £480 including VAT. In 2022-23 five season tickets were sold. The Committee agreed the Policy with it being reviewed later in the year, in time for 2023/24.

The RFO considers that, as there were recent uplifts and with the work and cost required to update the Order, car park machines and tariff boards, that the charges should remain the same.

Does the Committee agree to recommend to the Finance and General Purposes Committee, that car park charges and car park season ticket prices remain the same?

3.2 Leeway charges

The sand companies are charged per ton of sand carried across Padstow Town Council Railway car park. The current charge of £0.18 per ton was increased from £0.15 on 1.4.22, therefore the RFO considers these remain the same.

Does the Committee agree to recommend to FGP to keep the leeway charges at £0.18 per ton?

4. Expenditure 2023/24:

4.1 <u>Car Park Enforcement</u>: The RFO is proposing to include a provision of £5000 for a Cornwall Council (CC) Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO) to enforce PTC car parks, leaving us room to fund some additional patrols, outside of the usual visits, should Cornwall Council have the capacity to offer more visits. The SLA for 2023/24 will be considered a at a future meeting of this Committee.

Does Committee agree to include this figure within the budget?

4.2 <u>Electricity Costs:</u> The Council's three-year fixed term contract for electricity commenced with EDF Energy in 2022, after many issues transferring the sites from Opus Energy. Worldwide energy costs have increased hugely over the last year and are expected to remain high and increase. There is no cap on business energy prices, so it is fortunate that the Council has a three-year deal.

4.3 Non-Domestic Rates

Provision for a slight increase has been included in 2023—24 Budget.

5. Council Business Plan

5.1 Any large capital projects (over £20,000) should be planned for within the budget and included in the Council's Business Plan – Capital Projects.

As Committee will know, due to the knock-on with COVID, the Council's Capital Projects were "pushed on" into future years, due to the uncertainty at the time, mainly relating to our income levels.

Committee's Capital Project - Camel roadway improvements (the area near the workshops at the start of the Camel trail) is included within the Council's Business Plan for Major Capital Projects in 2023/24 at £20,000.

Does Committee wish to recommend this project remain, if so at the cost outlined?

Are there any other projects the Committee would like to include in the Budget for 2023/24?
