

Collaborative action impacts drugs gangs across the South West

More than £800,000 worth of drugs and 267 weapons have been taken off the streets in the seventh iteration of an initiative designed to create a 'ring of steel' around the South West.

A collaboration between police forces in Dorset, Devon & Cornwall, Avon & Somerset, Gloucestershire and Wiltshire, their respective Police and Crime Commissioners, British Transport Police, the South West Regional Organised Crime Unit (SW ROCU), and the charity Crimestoppers, Operation Scorpion focuses on pooling resources to combat drug supply in the region to make the South West a hostile environment for drugs.

Good news! 26th March, a male from Bodmin attended Truro Magistrates Court having been remanded overnight

charged by police with 3 counts of criminal damage and 1 count of drunk and disorderly behaviour. The damages included smashed windows at a pub in Wadebridge, a smashed window of a vehicle in Bodmin and also having thrown a television which didn't belong to him at a property in Bodmin.

The case has been postponed whilst further details are obtained from victims. In the meantime, court bail conditions have been imposed.



On Monday 11th March a car failed to stop for police officers from the Roads Policing Team in Bodmin

Following a pursuit, the vehicle was brought to a safe stop on Launceston Road shortly before 11pm. A large quantity of suspected cocaine was found within the vehicle and seized by police.

A 26-year-old man and a 16-year old girl, both from Derbyshire, along with a 39-year-old woman from Newquay have been arrested on suspicion of possession with intent to supply a Class A drug. They remain in police custody at this time with enquiries ongoing.



Devon & Cornwall Police warn young people about dangerous, illegal vaping liquid

The Police have seen a rise in illegal vapes, where the vape liquid has been replaced with Class B drugs THC (the active compound in cannabis) and spice (a synthetic cannabinoid). Due to the levels of these controlled substances in the vapes being unknown, the risks to teenagers taking these substances present health risks which are uncertain and have led to hospitalisations in other parts of the country. An innovative new online product which aims to transform the experience of victims and witnesses in the criminal justice system in Devon and Cornwall has been hailed as an "invaluable asset" by Victims Minister Laura Farris.

Criminal Justice and You, launched (Monday, March 4, 2024), is a first-of-its-kind multimedia resource developed by victims for victims, bringing all aspects of the criminal justice system into one place, with the aim of demystifying every step of the process.

The interactive resource has been created by the Devon and Cornwall Local Criminal Justice Board (LCJB) in conjunction with the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) for Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

The project features videos of partners working in their own area of expertise from across the criminal justice arena, speaking directly to victims and witnesses to explain what to expect at each stage, from reporting a crime through to the conclusion of a case.

There is also information about accessing victim services and restorative justice, as well as what happens if a case doesn't go to court or if the perpetrator is under the age of 18. Details are also provided of how to make a complaint if a victim or witness is unhappy with the service they have been provided.

To ensure accessibility, the videos feature a British Sign Language translator, and transcripts are viewable as a plain text document for anyone who experiences difficulty with a video format, or who wishes to view the information in another language.

Police and Crime Commissioner Alison Hernandez said the new resource would prove invaluable to anyone who feels they need support or clarity, and will be an important tool in ensuring transparency around the criminal justice system.

Criminal Justice and You is hosted on the OPCC's Victim Care Devon & Cornwall website, which helps victims to access specialist support services at any time, even if a crime hasn't been reported to police.

We wanted to share some great results from awesome dog teams (including handlers!) over the past week 1. PD Saka attended a single vehicle RTC where a vehicle had flipped multiple times, ejecting the driver. Saka tracked, navigating main roads, woodland and farmers fields before finding the driver 1.5 miles away buried deep within a hedge trying to hide.

Result: One arrested drink/drug driving

2. PD Albert attended a fight involving batons and knives. A suspect tried to sneak out the back of a house but didn't get far. Another was located inside, then Albert completed an area search finding the third suspect and further evidence.

Result: Three arrested for affray

3. PD Nero assisted officers with a high risk domestic offender who made off after assaulting his ex partner. While searching the area, the offender was located by Nero on a footpath in woodland near the address. PD Nero convinced him not to run.

Result: One in custody

This week our dogs have also visited schools and colleges to work with safeguarding staff and ensure there were no illegal drugs on site. It's been wonderful to see so many positive young people be so welcoming to our dogs.
